Liz, Karina, and Aimee have been match racing together since early 2000 and won the 2002 Women's Match Racing World Championship. In 2002 Liz also won her class in the Pacific Cup (San Francisco to Hawaii). By virtue of these victories, Liz was named the 2002 Rolex Yachtswoman of the Year.

Pease also is a Rolex Yachtswoman of the Year, earning the title following her silver medal in the 470 class in the 2000 Olympic Games with J.J. Isler. Prior to teaming up with Isler, she held the record as the longest consecutive member of the U.S. Sailing Team, with three previous Olympic campaigns as a 470 and Tornado skipper.
